
### Claus' sensitive writing is hard to match

In 'Regarding Deedee', Claus once again employs multiple narrative perspectives to tell the tale, allowing him to create an exciting story with a layered structure. Each of the seven chapters is told from the viewpoint of a different character, so the reader experiences the perspectives of all the family members. There is Pastor Deedee, who, under the pressure of the situation around him, refuses to provide moral support, thereby driving the oldest brother's stepson to suicide. Charming Natalie, the burlesque family members, roguish young Claude – all of these form the tableau vivant that is 'Regarding Deedee'.
