Meanwhile there's a lot to be seen: a colony of ants transports a crumb, two sparrows fight over a berry and a bee dances about in its search for nectar. But that's not what Slug is waiting for, and she urges Toad to keep looking. When the sun rises, it becomes clear to the reader what Slug means: the rays of light shine through the leaves and create an extraordinary light spectacle. Meanwhile Toad has become too agitated to be able to enjoy the sparkling splendour. Slug heads off on her journey, still dazzled by what she has just seen, and almost bumps into Toad. Ironically, it's now Toad who urges Slug to pay more attention.
